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Mozart's Requiem

According to legend Mozart was in a depressed state of mind when he received an anonymous commission to compose a Requiem Mass. His health was deteriorating, and he believed he had been cursed to write a requiem as a 'swansong' for himself, because he was sure he was about to die.

A Requiem is a Catholic mass for the dead or a liturgy for use at funerals and memorial services that over the centuries countless composers have set to music in a variety of ways.

Mozart's Requiem (1791) is perhaps the most famous example of a Requiem and contains some of Mozart's most rapturous and poignant music.

The Requiem was the last piece Mozart worked on and was left unfinished at his death in 1791. The work was completed by Franz Xaver Süssmayer and Joseph Eybler with the edition in use at this performance based on original sources by David Black.

Special Guest Conductor: Dr. Joshua Wood

Dr. Wood has performed, conducted, and taught music throughout Canada and the United States. Since 2016, he has served as Music Director of the Timmins Symphony Orchestra and Chorus (TSO), and since 2022 he has served as Music Director of the North Bay Symphony Orchestra.

A native of London, Ontario, Josh completed his Bachelor of Music (Hons. Performance) degree at Western University before pursuing graduate studies in Horn and Conducting at the Eastman School of Music and the University of Cincinnati. He is an alumnus of the National Youth Orchestra of Canada, National Academy Orchestra, Banff Summer Masterclass Program, and the Académie Domaine Forget.

An active soloist and chamber musician, he regularly performs as a member of the TSO Chamber Ensemble and has also performed with numerous orchestras including the Sudbury Symphony Orchestra, North Bay Symphony Orchestra, Richmond (IN) Symphony Orchestra, Orchestra London Canada/London Symphonia, Guelph Symphony Orchestra, and Stratford Symphony Orchestra.

Currently the brass and advanced piano instructor at the TSO's Geoffrey James Lee School of Music, Josh has taught extensively, including numerous collegiate lecture and masterclass presentations in Canada and the U.S., and he is a former faculty member of the Kincardine Summer Music Festival.

As a conductor, he has worked with the University of Cincinnati Wind Ensemble and Concert Orchestra, the London Community Orchestra, members of the Western Symphony, CCM Chamber Winds, and the London Youth Orchestra, as well as several secondary school ensembles in the U.S. In his free time, Josh enjoys cross-country skiing, mountain biking, hockey, tennis, baseball, and fishing.

Beth made her soloist debut at the age of 16 with the Cincinnati Symphony Orchestra. The Los Angeles Times described her as a "prodigious talent, poised, introspective and very impressive." She has performed throughout the Americas and Europe as a soloist, chamber musician and orchestral player and performs on 15 recordings, two receiving Grammy Contentions.

As an avid chamber musician and member of Duo46, she is an advocate of music by living composers and has commissioned with her spouse, guitarist Dr. Matt Gould over 100 pieces. Duo46's performances are characterized by a deep musical understanding and a commitment to new music. Their eclectic repertoire reflects their passion for exploring new sounds and styles. Formerly a member of the San Antonio Symphony and assistant professor at Eastern Mediterranean University in Cyprus, Schneider-Gould's technical excellence, musicality, and innovative programming have earned her critical acclaim. Her recordings have been praised for their artistry and their ability to capture her unique sound and energy. Whether performing on stage, recording in the studio, or teaching the next generation of musicians, Beth continues to push the boundaries of classical music and inspire audiences with her artistry, passion, and dedication to new music.
